Falling/slipping in the brook	All	All site participants to be briefed on water safety, not to climb the flood mound or go near the brook.  Staff to be with young people and supervising on a 121 ratio if conducting environmental studies.  Young people to always remain under supervision and in sight of a responsible adult.  Stay clear of boggy areas of the site to avoid slips, trips or falls into deeper areas.	Annual maintenance on the flood mound. Seeding the mound with wildflowers to deter climbing and promote responsible environmental measures.	Staff
Stagnant water:  • Waterborne Diseases • Mosquito Breeding: • Legionnaires' Disease: Legionella bacteria	All	Good Drainage: Ensuring proper drainage systems to prevent water from pooling and becoming stagnant.  Water Quality Testing: Regularly test water quality to identify potential hazards.  Education and Training: Educate staff and visitors about the risks of stagnant water and how to prevent it.  Signage: Use clear signage to warn people about potential hazards associated with stagnant water.	Regular Maintenance: Annual dredging of the brook area.	MLH/Staff
Barbed wire along fence line	All	Barbed wire located along the perimeter of the site borders to rear and along fence line of housing.  Young people and staff to be made aware of barbed wire locations.  No activities to be conducted near fence line.	To plant Hawthorne trees along perimeters to deter and prevent visitors from injury.	MLH/Staff
Toilet Access (Through car park)	YP	Toilets are located on the Bowls Club site. Access to toilet is through the car park.		MLH/Staff

Nettles, Nettle clusters. Falling into nettle clusters	All	Briefing staff and young people on nettles in the area.  Check current allergies of ALL people on site.  Qualified First Aid staff members on site to treat nettle stings.	Annual maintenance of nettles in areas to reduce population.  Seeding wild flowers to discourage nettle growth	MLH/Staff
